# NEW PROGRAMME PERIOD 2007-2013

The programme is being split into two parts:

- **Central Europe**
- **South East European Space**

Both programmes focus on territorial cooperation (3<sup>rd</sup> main objective of the EU cohesion policy in the programming period 2007-2013)

# CADSES 2007-2013

- The new **CENTRAL** programme will include eight Member States (Czech Republic, parts of Germany, parts of Italy, Hungary, Austria, Poland, Slovenia and Slovak Republic) and one Partner State (Ukraine).
- **SEES** will comprise Austria, Bulgaria, Greece, Hungary, parts of Italy, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Romania, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, FYR Macedonia, Moldova, Serbia and Montenegro.
- The Managing Authority and the Technical Secretariat for the **CENTRAL** Programme will be located in Vienna, the **Managing Authority and the Secretariat for South East Europe** in Budapest.

# EU Water Framework Directive

The key objective of the WFD is to promote sustainable water use by protecting water resources.

Article 14 of the WFD provides that:

“Member States shall encourage active involvement of all interested parties in the implementation of the Directive, not only regarding the development of a river basin management plan, but from the very beginning of the implementation of the WFD. Public participation plays a key role in the implementation of the EU Water Framework Directive “.

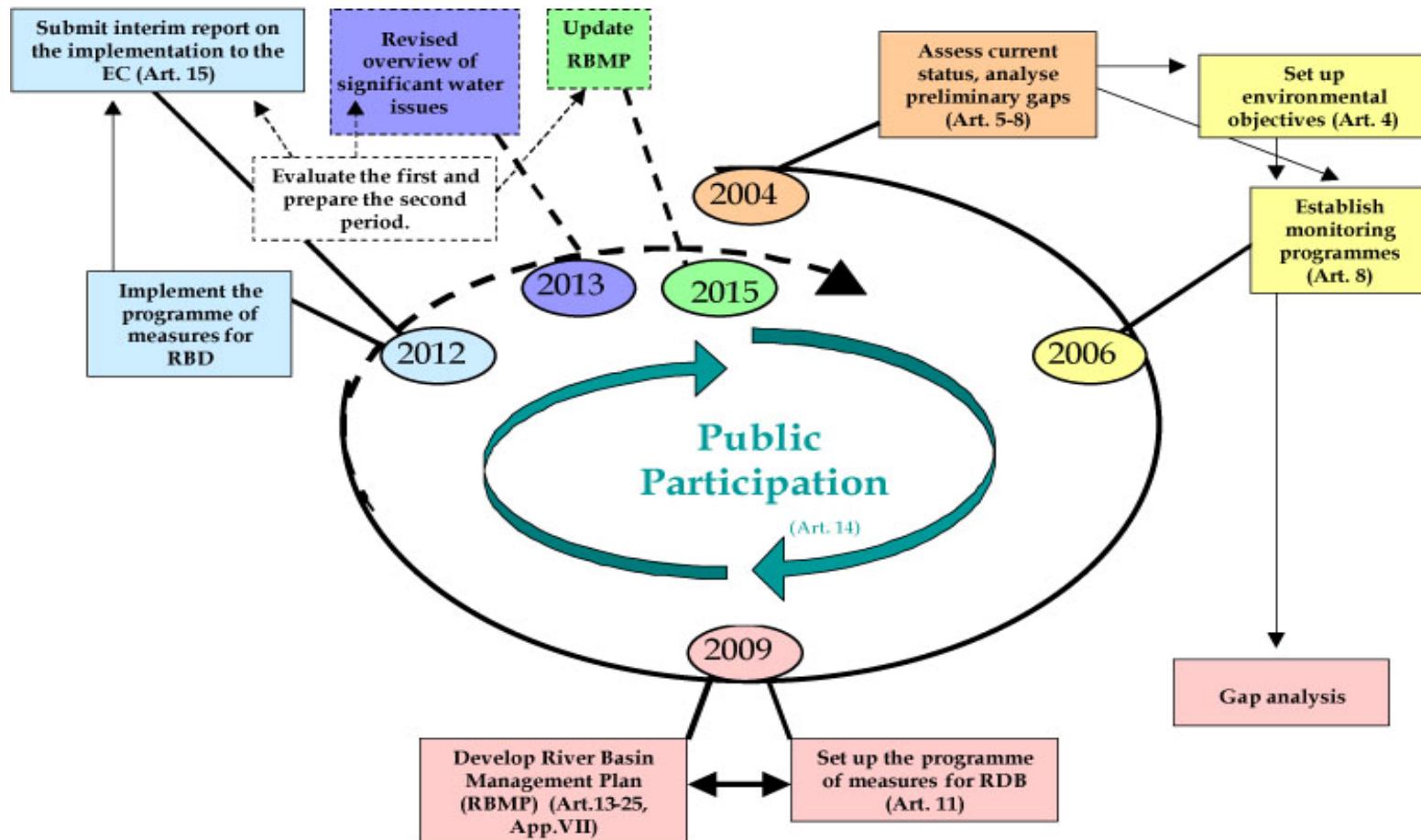
# PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE WFD

There are many reasons to start a public participation process.  
The key benefits include:

- better-informed and more creative decision making;
- increased public acceptance, less litigation, fewer delays and more effective implementation;
- more open and integrated governance and more transparency in the planning process;
- a broader knowledge base through the use of stakeholder's knowledge and experience;
- promotion of social learning through a constructive dialogue in which all relevant parties involved - the various publics, governments and experts - learn from each other.

The WFD, therefore, brings new and innovative concepts to sustainable water management in Europe.

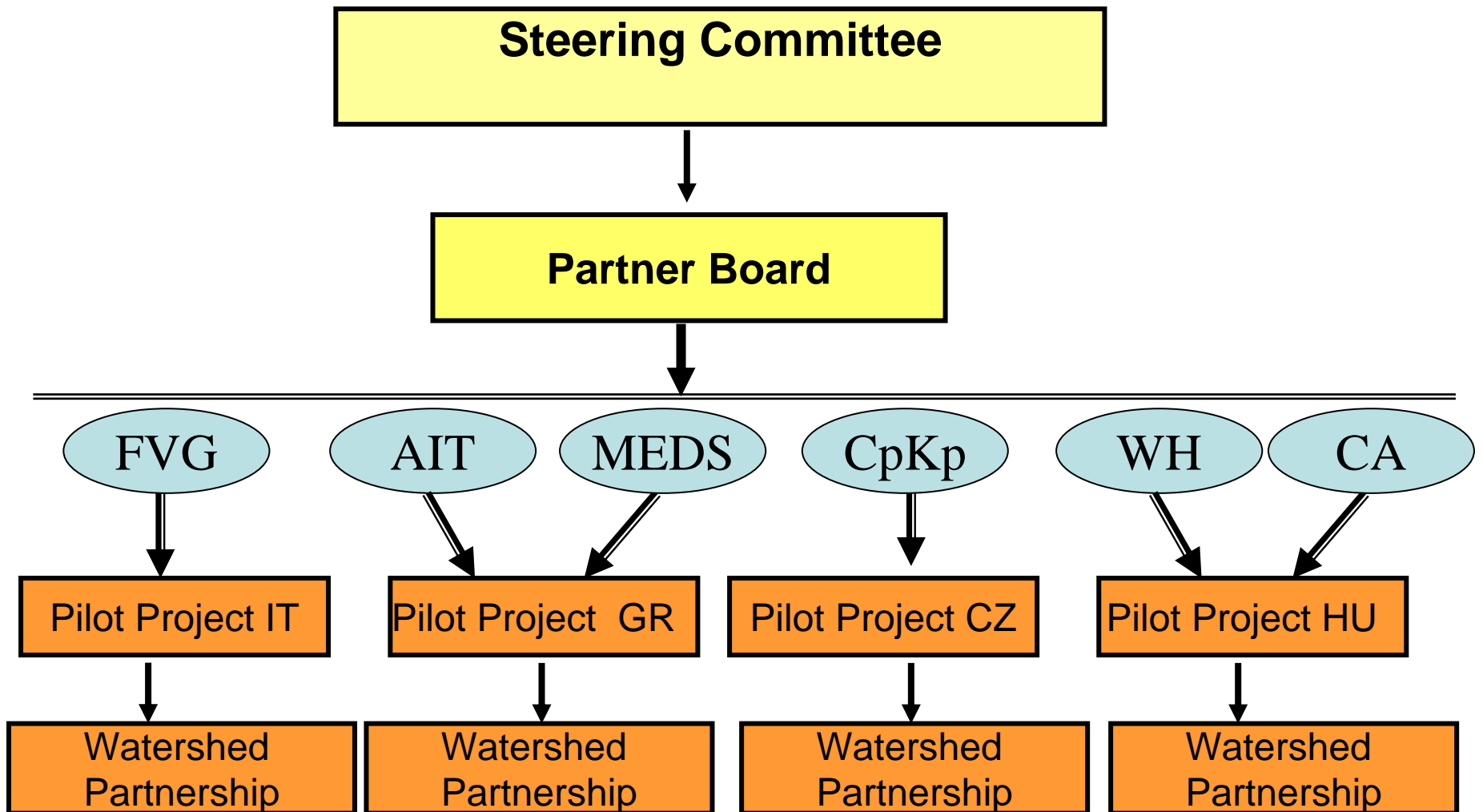

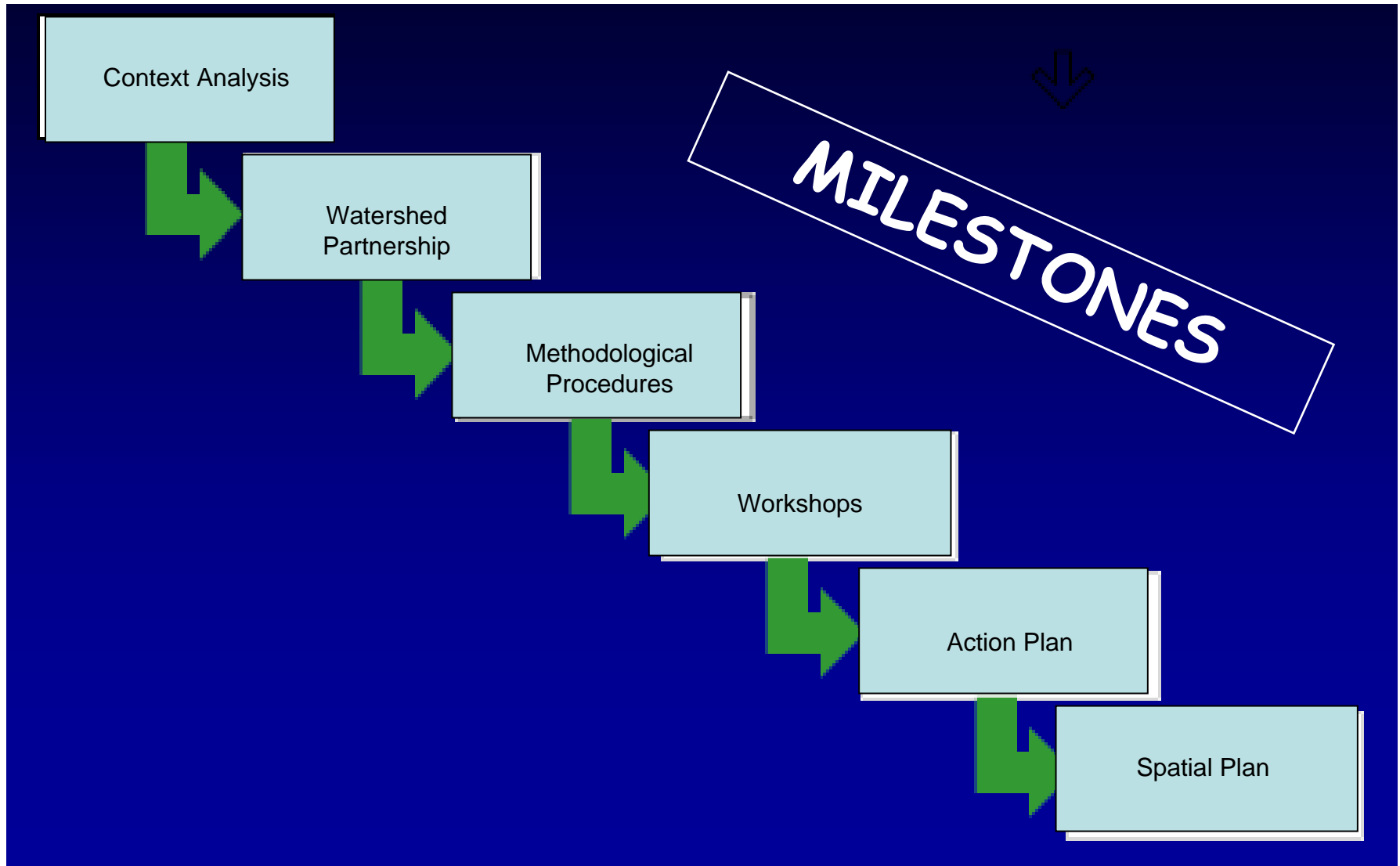

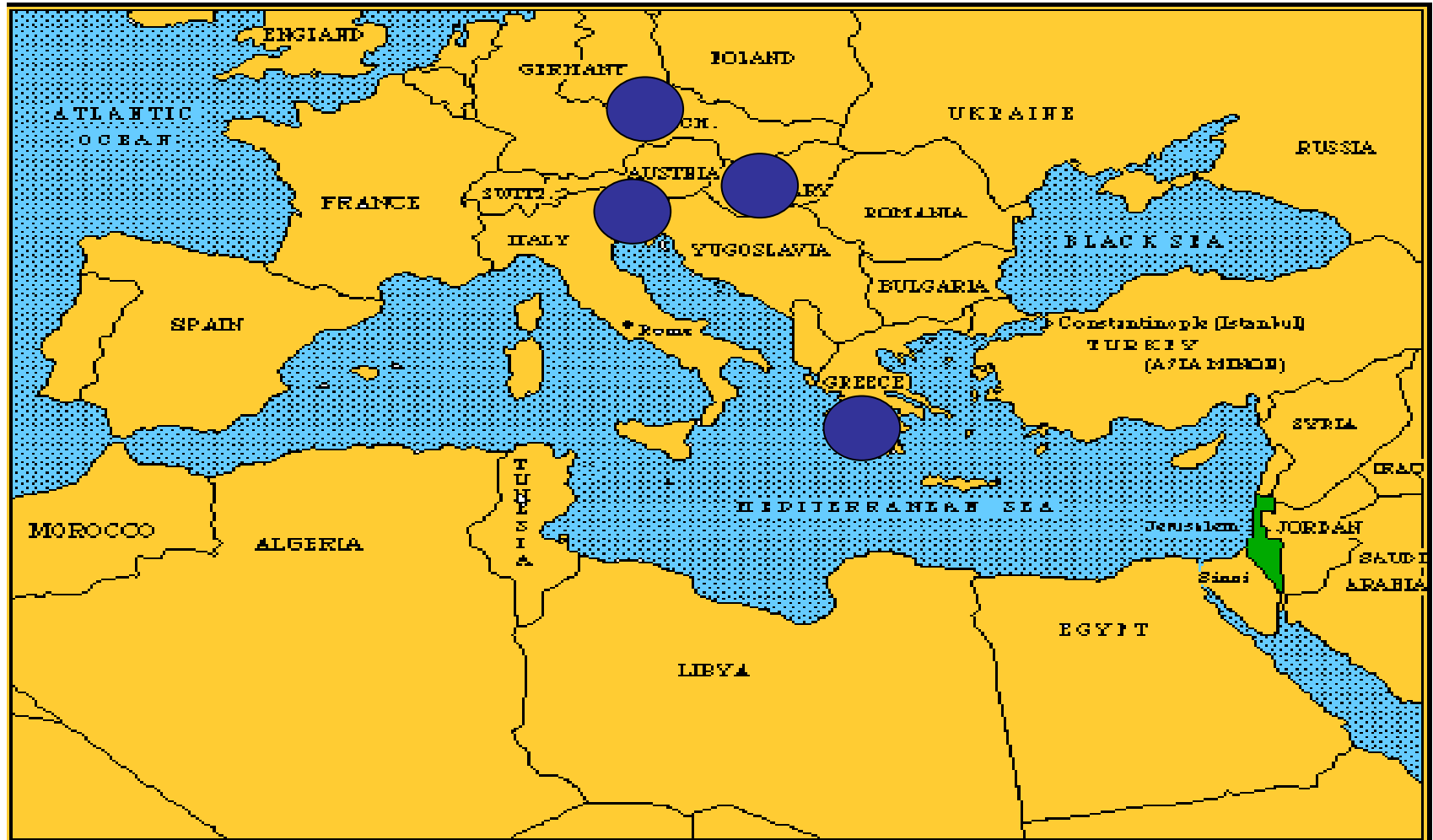


# OBJECTIVES

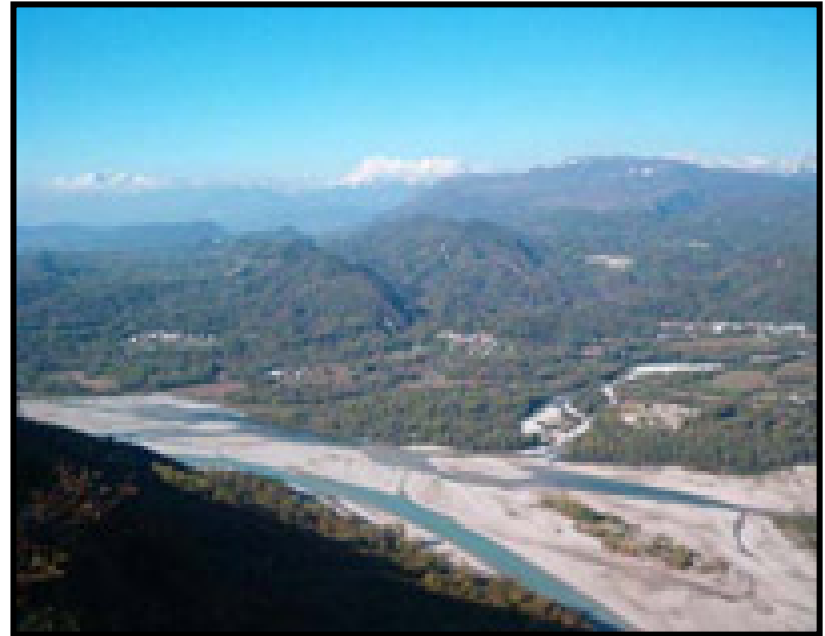
